Job Purpose: Gordonstoun has been leading the way in outdoor education for more than 80 years. Responsibilities of all members of staff:

- Carry out any other task as required from time to time in order to support the School.

Key Responsibilities

- Inspire students by providing a comprehensive, inspiring and educational range of outdoor and adventure learning sessions, programmes and expeditions in both the senior and junior schools.
- Support the outdoor and adventure learning department to achieve outstanding outcomes for students in a safe manner.
- Assist students who may require additional support in the relevant area, including those with advanced skills.
- Lead day, evening and weekend activities as required, including working on multi day wilderness expeditions.
- Manage the regular administration and maintenance of outdoor and adventure learning equipment.
- Assist in all aspects of the administration of the outdoor education and learning department.
- Assist the Head of Department in ensuring all activities are run in accordance with the relevant risk assessment and safety management procedures.

Students

- Establish high expectations of students by setting down clear guidelines for establishing good standards of behaviour and achievement, including the care of equipment.
- Contribute to the relevant department procedures for the monitoring and recording of student progress.
- Adhere to the school's assessment, reporting and recording framework and ensure the agreed policy is followed by members of the team including the consistent awarding of merits across the department.

Whole School Responsibilities

- To further the tone and purpose of the School by example.
- To foster and support activities in the interests of the school community.

Community Responsibilities

- To ensure effective dialogue with parents in accordance with school policies.
- Support promotional outdoor education and learning events.
- To write reports on individual students on their progress in their relevant subject in accordance with the school reporting policies and timetables
- To liaise with external agencies and employers as necessary
- To develop our relationship with other schools and the wider community, this is particularly important as staff and students are considered ambassadors for the School during trips, and expeditions.

This is a full time, year round post, but we expect the majority of the hours to be worked during term time on an annualised basis.
