

# MAINTENANCE JOINER

**Job Purpose:** Our Estate is set in over 150 acres of the stunning Moray countryside and is made up of a broad range of buildings providing classroom, office space and living accommodation for up to 600 people.

The main purpose of the Maintenance Joiner is to provide general planned and reactive maintenance, installations and repairs to a variety of integral structures within campus buildings. As part of the Estates Team, the Joiner will participate in, and successfully complete joinery works contributing to many diverse Capital Projects that take place on campus.

The Maintenance Joiner might also, in time, demonstrate the aptitude to assume further responsibility as the Maintenance Supervisor.

### Grade and working hours: 2BN – 37.5 hours per week

### Responsibilities of all members of staff:

- Comply with Gordonstoun's policies and procedures on Child Protection and Health and Safety.

- Carry out any other task as required from time to time in order to support the School.

### Major responsibilities of the role:

- Repair and refurbish existing building works
- Making and fitting specific items and/or furniture from staircases to kitchen cabinets
- Constructing and fitting shelving units
- Repairing and maintenance doors, door frames, window etc.
- Snagging works including joinery and basic re-decoration such as taping and filling, painting etc.
- Matching, ordering and tracking of relevant buildings materials and supplies as needed
- Ensuring all work is carried out in accordance with the requirements of Health and Safety and other relevant legislation
- Providing a service to clients and maintain good customer service and relationships

- Repairs to and maintaining fixtures such as door handles, locks, cabinet handles, stairway railings and other relevant fixtures
- Utilise skills in and assist other related trades such as plumbing, roofing, painting and decorating etc.
- Participate in first fixing as well as second fixing work
- Repair, replace and maintenance hard wood and other material make up flooring
- Communicate and work efficiently with all staff within Maintenance and other departments within Facilities
- Be available for on-call duties in rotation
